


Washington State is still feeling the effects of the worst and most enduring economic downturn since the Great Depression. The state's economy has recovered substantially with the Puget Sound Region anchoring growth in employment in several key sectors. Although the state and national economy have recovered substantially, the economic environment that planners work within has fundamentally changed. For example, wages in the United States have remained flat and while unemployment has decreased substantially, long term unemployment remains an issue across the country.
